MODULES/UNITS

Dramatic styles

- Developing skills in devising.
- Developing the use of space and movement.

History of Theatre

- Students study the theatre of ancient Greece, through to the present day.
- Learn and apply the styles for each period of theatre in the context of the present day.

Romeo and Juliet

- A practical exploration of Shakespeare's language.
- How to perform using text as a stimulus.

Sparkle Shark

- Physical theatre and using only the body in performance.
- A look at different staging's.

Joy Riding

- Using Forum Theatre to engage the audience.
- To take a real life situation and dramatise it.

MOCK UNIT 3

- An introduction in the exam unit for GCSE
- 7 week project to devise a performance based on a topic of your choice.

COURSEWORK DEADLINES/EXAMS

Students are assessed regularly and progress shared and discussed.

Drama levels are given and targets set as to how to reach the next level.

Students are assessed in Drama on:

1. Group work skills.
2. Voice and movement.
3. Use of techniques, form and structure.
4. Ability to evaluate (verbally and through written work).

Students are required to research around the topic for homework. They are able to watch their performances and assess their progress, as well as reflecting through written work. At the end of each unit of work students will identify their progress and areas for improvement.
