GCSE COURSE OUTLINE

Unit 1 - Key Developments in US Film

A comparative study of a range of US Hollywood films exploring:

- Genre, narrative and representation
- Key developments in film technology
- Specialist writing

Students will be required to watch the full length of a minimum of three films within the classroom.

Unit 2 - Global Film

Students will study three international films analyzing:

- Cinematography, mise en scene, editing and sound
- Context of film (social, historical, cultural and political)

Unit 3 - Film Production Exploring Genre

Students create and evaluate their own two minute film opening or key sequence from a new genre based film.
