ASSESSMENT & HOMEWORK

The majority of assessment in Key Stage 3 music is of a formative nature, where progress and targets are discussed with students on a regular basis. On at least a termly basis, students are awarded a level according to their current attainment and targets are set in order for students to determine how they can go about reaching the next level.

Students are broadly assessed in the following areas:

- Their ability to work as a group.
- Their understanding of relevant musical vocabulary.
- Their understanding of style and in composing or performing in line with this.
- Their use of technique, and the seven musical elements: structure, dynamics, tempo, timbre, texture, pitch and rhythm.
- Their ability to lead others.

Homework is not frequently set, but will usually require students to research or evaluate a topic. They may also be asked to listen to certain pieces of music.

OTHER INFORMATION

Students can refer to SAM-E to access numerous department resources including links, worksheets, audio/video resources and homework tasks.

There are numerous opportunities available for budding musicians. Students are encouraged to enrich their musical experience by contributing to extra-curricular activities, including two orchestras, a brass group, two woodwind groups, a swing band and two choirs. There is also the opportunity to put themselves forward for *PERFORM* which is a celebration of the arts at Samuel Ward Academy.
